Commissioner Lyall moved and President Sewell seconded a motion to approve the Amendment to Ground Lease with Addie Sybouts, increasing rent from \$400 a month to \$450 a month, plus 12.84% leasehold tax, for a total of \$451.36 per month. Motion carried.

#### AMENDMENT TO GROUND LEASE

Port of Grandview- Addison Kay Sybouts

**THIS IS AN AMENDMENT** to the Ground Lease entered into between the PORT OF GRANDVIEW, a municipal corporation of the State of Washington, referred to as "Port" and ADDISON KAY SYBOUTS doing business as "Peace Love and Coffee", referred to as "Tenant", dated October 1, 2015. The Ground Lease and the Amendment to Ground Lease shall hereafter be referred to jointly as "Lease".

THE PARTIES HEREBY AGREE the Ground Lease shall be amended as follows:

#### A. Section 3 of the Ground Lease shall be amended to read as follows:

**3. RENT**. The Lessee shall pay rent for the demised premises in the amount of \$400.00 each month in advance, plus the applicable leasehold tax of \$51.36, for a total monthly payment of \$451.36, effective January 1<sup>st</sup>, 2023.

**B.** Except as specifically amended by this Amendment to Ground Lease, all of the terms and conditions of the Ground Lease shall remain in full force and effect.

c) <u>2022 American Rescue Plan Act Fund Update</u> – Executive Director Randy Tucker reported that there has been no response to the Port's application for funding.

Office Manager Mary Barnett reported that she has emailed Stacey Kautz at the YVC Foundation regarding the 2022 program scholarship status and is awaiting a reply.

- e) WA State Grape Society Annual Meeting & Trade Show Banner Executive Director Randy Tucker reported that he picked up the trade show banner ordered from Minute Man Press. Randy has talked to the City about where to display the banner, and the City says they will install it.

- g) <u>YCDA Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy Grant</u> Executive Director Randy Tucker reported that the Port has not received a response to their application for the grant.

- i. <u>Broadband Update CERB Planning Grant, Petrichor</u>
  - Joe Poire, Manager at Petrichor Broadband LLC, presented a draft of Petrichor's Broadband Feasibility Study for Grandview. President Sewell commended Joe and Executive Director Randy Tucker for their work on the report.

## ii. <u>Wallace Way Business Park West Update</u>

- **Construction Update** Executive Director Randy Tucker reported that Culbert is one week behind on construction. City will be meeting with J-U-B and Culbert regarding engineering. Culbert should be back on track by Monday.
- **Boundaries for Marketing Purposes** Randy Tucker discussed with Commissioners the Wallace Way BP West boundary changes for marketing purposes.
- **Disposition of Pump** Randy Tucker and Commissioners discussed surplusing the pump removed from Wallace Way BP West.

a) <u>Resolution No. 22-07</u> - A Resolution of the Port of Grandview Affirming Existing Boundaries for the Commissioner Districts

Commissioner Lyall moved and Commissioner Sewell seconded a motion to approve Resolution No. 22-07, a resolution pursuant to RCW29A.76 and RCW 53.16 affirming the existing boundaries for commissioner districts. Motion carried.

RESOLUTION NO. 22-07 A RESOLUTION OF THE PORT COMMISSION OF THE PORT OF GRANDVIEW, WASHINGTON PURSUANT TO RCW 29A.76 AND RCW 53.16, AFFIRMING THE EXISTING BOUNDARIES FOR THE COMMISSIONER DISTRICTS

**WHEREAS,** in accordance with RCW 53.16.020 and Chapter 29A.76.010 RCW, the Commission for the Port of Grandview ("Commission") is required to examine the District's boundaries according to the 2020 federal decennial census information for Yakima County and establish Commissioner District Boundaries consistent with the purpose and goals of Chapter 29A.76 RCW and Chapter 53.16 RCW;

**WHEREAS,** on October 4, 2022, the Commission determined that the Port District boundaries require no changes because of de minimis changes to population reported by the 2020 federal decennial census;

**WHEREAS**, the Port of Grandview redistricting plan, showing no changes to the existing Port District boundaries, was published as a draft plan on October 19, 2022 and October 26, 2022, pursuant to RCW 29A.76.010(5);

**WHEREAS,** on November 1, 2022, pursuant to RCW 29A.76.010(5) and RCW 53.16.020 and following legally required notice, the Commission held a public hearing to receive public comment on the draft redistricting plan;

**WHEREAS**, following the public hearing, the Commission considered the draft redistricting plan and found that the criteria set forth in RCW 29A.76.010(4) have been satisfied; and

**WHEREAS**, the Commission now desires to establish the Commissioner District Boundaries for the Port of Grandview as set forth in the districting plan attached hereto as Exhibit "A" (note that the Port District boundaries remain unchanged).

#### NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS RESOLVED

- 1. That the Districts depicted in Exhibit "A" meet the criteria set forth in RCW 29A.76.010(4).
- 2. That the Districts depicted on Exhibit "A" with the corresponding commission district numbers are hereby established as the commissioner districts for the Port of Grandview.
- 3. That all prior actions and resolutions by the Port of Grandview regarding Commissioner districts are superseded by this Resolution.
- 4. That the Commission hereby directs Commission staff to take further administrative action, as may be required or appropriate under the law, to implement the adopted districting plan, to include, if necessary, preparing a legal description of the newly established boundaries and submitting the districting plan to the Yakima County Auditor for mapping and recording. The plan adopted hereunder shall supersede any previous descriptions and maps that address Commissioner Districts.

**ADOPTED** by the Board of Commissioners on the 8th day of November, 2022, and duly authenticated in open session by the signature of the Commissioners voting in favor thereof.
